Tri-Luma (Triple Lightening Cream)

Tri-Luma/Triple Lightening Cream is a medication used to treat melasma and other hyperpigmented areas of the skin. It is a combination of three medications:

Tretinoin (Retin-A) – a skin peeling agent to allow better penetration Hydroquinone – the main bleaching agent Fluocinolone acetonide or Triamcinolone – a mild steroid to minimize irritation

How to use: Apply Tri-Luma/Triple Lightening Cream to the affected areas once a day (preferably at bedtime) for at least 6-8 weeks and then as needed thereafter. If you overlap onto normal colored skin – that is OK since it will not tend to lighten normal skin.

Important points:

- *Sun avoidance and regular use of sunscreens is imperative since even one day in the sun will set you back to square one.
- *Be advised that Tri-Luma is expensive costing around \$110.00 and is often not covered by insurance since it is considered a "cosmetic" medication. Triple Lightening Cream is a compounded medication composed of the same three medications for half the cost. This will be sent to a specialty pharmacy.
- *It may take 6-8 weeks to appreciate results if you have not responded in that time frame then you should discontinue the cream since it is ineffective.
- *Mild to moderate redness, peeling, burning, dryness or itching may be experienced.
- * Tri-Luma/Triple Lightening Cream contains hydroquinone, which may produce exogenous ochronosis, a gradual blue-black darkening of the skin, whose occurrence should prompt discontinuation of therapy.
